Not A Building



It has often been said that 'Home' is where the Heart is. But 'Home' means so much more than just a house or a building. So how do we encourage, foster and reassure the residents of both the Bedok and Bishan Homes that their building or establishment is their 'Home'?

Someone once wrote that "individuals develop very strong emotional attachments to the places they live in". Thus it is the 'Home' where a sense of meaning and organisation is created in the individual's

life, where one feels in control, secure and oriented.

However, this "state" may be difficult to attain or achieve, as long-term healthcare facilities are necessarily regulated organisations tending to function as institutions. They are, even at best, not naturally comfortable or as pleasant as our homes may be.

A strong emphasis has been placed on the quality of life in nursing homes in recognising the tendency to establish "institutional" characteristics at the expense of a warm home-like atmosphere. Care processes and environments that are more welcoming and accommodating to the residents than an institution thus need to be paid special attention.

A variety of meaningful activities are an integral component of residents' lives, and contribute to the physical, mental, and psychosocial well-being of each resident, as well as to help them maintain, for as long as possible, a sense of independence and positive self-image and dignity.

Residents must feel secure and confident in their environment. Physical environment and settings should allow residents to function to their highest level.

There should be ample opportunities for residents to engage in meaningful social interchange with other residents, staff and / or family and friends. The larger community surrounding the 'Home' should be encouraged to welcome, participate and form bonds with residents.

The Lions Home for the Elders is 'Home' to over 300 residents requiring specialised medical and rehabilitative care. Sustaining the provision of quality, resident-centred care by efficient and caring staff may not be enough. They must also be ensured a physical environment that aims to support and continually improve residents' quality of life. All who have a stake in the Lions Home for the Elders, must assure its residents that they will be spending their twilight years in not "just a building", but a special 'Home' where their hearts are.

Peace of Mind

"If there is one thing I could change, I hope to take away her pain, so she would never have to suffer again," said Mr Lee Choon Hwa.

For nearly 20 years, the Lee siblings were under the care of their devoted mother, Madam Tan. However, in 2000, Madam Tan's independence was taken away when she suffered a stroke. Being the sole breadwinner of the family, Mr Lee supported the family and relied on a domestic helper to look after his mother.

However, things took a turn for the worse in 2009, when Madam Tan had one of her legs amputated due to diabetes. Mr Lee admitted that caring for his mother became more stressful. and many helpers came and left as they found it extremely gruelling to look after his ill mother.

A regular check-up led 52-year-old Mr Lee, to the diagnosis of blocked coronary arteries. To prevent the risk of a fatal heart attack, Mr Lee sought treatment and underwent a heart bypass surgery in October 2015. He went back to work, healthy once again.

In April 2016, one of their longest serving helpers, was compelled to leave the Lee family to return to her hometown to get married. It was challenging to find a suitable helper in such a short period

"Those new trainee helpers were terrified upon seeing my mom. They told me straight to my face that they could not handle someone without legs," Mr Lee recalled. At that time, Mr Lee was overwhelmed by a sense of hopelessness and despair as he could not get a replacement helper to look after his mother. Mr Lee searched frantically for a nursing home but all his efforts were futile. The stress was too much for him to bear. In his desperation, Mr Lee barged into the Lions Home and got into an altercation with the security guard. This came to the attention of Dorothy Low, our Senior Public / Social

Welfare Executive, who invited him to her office and tried to calm him down.

Mr Lee shared, "Dorothy is so kind, she empathised with me on my predicament, comforted me and worked with her colleague, Executive, Lin Yau Yeng, to figure out how they could assist me." The Lions Home connected Mr Lee to the Agency for Integrated Care (AIC) and in June 2016, Madam Tan was admitted to the Lions Home in Bishan. Mr Lee continued, "The support I received from the Lions Home and AIC eased my worries tremendously. I realised there are still kind souls around. These are people who were once complete strangers to me."

Mr Lee visited Madam Tan whenever he had off days. "Witnessing my mother being attentively taken care of by the nurses in the Lions Home gave me peace of mind. I am truly grateful to AIC and especially, staff of the Lions Home who gave me strength and lifted me up during my darkest moments," said a smiling Mr Lee, with a gleam in his eyes.
